Plenary Session 2

Prof. Roel Baets

EMA1 Coordinator, Ghent University

Professor Roel Baets received MSc degrees in electrical engineering from Ghent University and Stanford University and a PhD from Ghent University in 1984. Since 1989 he has been a professor in Ghent University's engineering faculty.

Roel Baets leads the Photonics Research Group. With about 300 SCI journal publications and 20 patents he has made contributions to research on photonic integrated components and ICs in III-V semiconductors and in silicon. He has been coordinator of large -scale European research projects, among which the NoE ePIXnet. He initiated the joint MSc programme in photonics with VUB and the Erasmus Mundus Master Course in Photonics. He is a Fellow of IEEE. He is currently the Director of The Center for Nano- and Biophotonics of Ghent University and is a holder of an ERC Advanced Grant.

Dr. Artur Schmitt

EMA2 Coordinator, University of Granada

Dr. Artur Schmitt is a Senior Lecturer of Applied Physics at the University of Granada and, since 2008, Director for International Networks and Projects at the Vice-Rectorate for International Relations and Development Cooperation. His sound expertise in international cooperation is not only a result of his duties as a representative of his university at international events and working groups but also of his participation in international, mostly EU funded projects such as Eumedis - ODISEAME, Erasmus Mundus Action 4 – CPCNASCE, Alfa III - VertebrAlcue, etc. He is a speaker, panellist and moderator at local, national and internationals events (conferences, meeting, info days, etc.).

As person in charge for the local coordination of all Erasmus Mundus projects in which the University of Granada is involved, he gained experience in this Programme almost from its beginning. Prof. Pierpaolo Faggi

Pierpaolo Faggi (1949) has been Professor of Human Geography at Padua University since 1994. He has carried out research on relationships between humans and the environment in dry areas, mainly in the Sahelo-Sudanese zone and Central Asia, with the principal focus on desertification and hydraulic territorialization.

He was Director of the Department of Geography at Padua University (2003 - 2010), Rector's Delegate for University Cooperation (2000 - 2008), and Chair of the ACP Task Force of the Coimbra Group (2004 - 2008). He is the coordinator of the Erasmus Mundus Master in Sustainable Territorial Development, with the Catholic University of Leuven, Paris 1 University and Universidade Catholica Dom Bosco, Campo Grande (Brazil).

Dr James Otieno JOWI

James Otieno Jowi is the founding Executive Director of the African Network for Internationalization of Education (ANIE), an African network focused on the international dimension of higher education in Africa. He heads the ANIE Secretariat based at Moi University, Kenya and is responsible for the implementation of ANIE activities. He is also teaches Comparative and International Education at the School of Education, Moi University, Kenya.

He holds a Bachelor of Education and Masters in Linguistics from Moi University (Kenya), a Masters in Comparative and International Education from University of Oslo, Norway. He is finalizing doctoral studies in Leadership and Governance of Higher Education. His interests are in internationalization of higher education and governance and management of higher education. He has been part of the IAU Task Force for the 3rd Global Survey on Internationalization.
