## EMA Course Quality Assessment – EMQA

- •Aims at examining how EMMC do things excellently, identifying best practices and sharing them among relevant stakeholders.
- •The project is under phase 4, phases 1-3 resulted in a Handbook of excellence accompanied by a Self-assessment EM excellence website

#### 2015 demographics

- •2131 respondents from 128 countries and 193 courses.
- •977 females (46%) and 1135 males (54%).
- 1674 (79%) with scholarship and 457 (21%) without.
- •71 courses with 10 or more respondents.

    - quality assessment.
