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A brief history: 2006-2011

- <u>2006</u>: "Erasmus Mundus MSc. in Photonics (EMMP)"
 - EM-contract for 5 starting classes
 - First EMMP class: 2006-2008
 - Last EMMP class: 2010-2012
- <u>2006-2011</u>: major efforts to develop an excellent programme
 - Based on high degree of trust and cohesion among partners
 - Based on excellent student feedback
 - Based on reports of our independent Quality Assurance Committee
- <u>2009-2010</u>: NVAO quality audit: excellent quality confirmed
- 2010 and 2011: two applications for new EM contract
 - Proposal declared of "very good quality" ("Group I")
 - But no contract
- <u>2011</u>: "European MSc. in Photonics (EMSP)" (name change)
 - Erasmus Mundus Brand Name
 - First EMSP class: 2011-2013: 14 students
 - \rightarrow Simplified course structure (simpler mobility scheme with fewer options)
 - \rightarrow New partnerships

Change happens

- <u>2006-2011</u>:
 - Build a programme that makes sense and brings immense value
 - to the students
 - to the institutions involved
 - to society
 - And do so without financial limiting factors nor worries
- <u>2011-?</u>
 - We are running an excellent programme but we find ourselves to be loosing money
 - We necessarily have to spend effort on creative financial management
 - Live on savings
 - Gratefully accept financial help from home university
 - Non-European partner and sponsor!
 - Contribute to manpower cost from research funds
 - Other...
 - Is it sustainable?

The financial dilemma

- <u>Set tuition fees high</u>?
 - No financial worries
 - No students
 - (see the examples in Scandinavia)
 - No value for society

- Lower tuition fees (tuition waivers, grants, ...)?
 - You get very good students!
 - You run at a loss

The paradox

- <u>2006-2011</u>
 - Students had luxurious EM-grants
 - Very large number of applications
 - Quality of selected students: good very good excellent

- <u>2011-?</u>
 - Most students are self-financed
 - Smaller number of applicants
 - Quality of selected students: good very good excellent

Excellent students go for quality/appeal, not for money (as long as they can survive)

The cost structure

- Pay the salary of a coordinating person
 - Professional coordination requires 50-100% FTE skilled person

- Pay the tuition bill from the participating universities
 - Trend towards "full-cost" tuition for non-EU citizens
 - Massive discrepancies throughout Europe
 - EMSP-programme
 - Expensive UK-partner
 - Swedish partner: political decision in 2011: abrupt change from 0 euro to 16K euro tuition for non-EU; result: KTH will drop out of our programme from 2012 onwards
- Pay for elements of attraction/value/excellence
 - Summer school

How are we surviving?

- Because in each institution there is a core group of professors that believes in it, no matter what
- Because a well-organized international master programme has value and the good applicants somehow recognize that
- Because we can afford, for the time being...
 - Live on savings
 - Gratefully accept financial help from home university
 - Non-European partner and sponsor!
 - Contribute to manpower cost from research funds
 - Other...
 - Inventors of patents agree to give away part of their personal financial benefit for student grants
- Because the Erasmus Mundus Brand Name has an impact in attracting good students

- No 1 academic institution in Asia
 - Local photonics M.Sc.
 - High research output
- 2nd year NTU-students join EMSP for sem. 3 & 4
 - → Supported by Chimei-NTU Grant
- Opportunity for EM-students: 4th semester: master thesis at NTU
 - → Supported by Chimei Excellence Grant

My message to EACEA

- Discontinuity from contractual funding to no funding is too abrupt and ill-conditioned: too high risk to delete precious value enabled by tax payers' money
- EM- grants are far too luxurious: much more (10x) impact possible with the same budget
- Call for proposals: structural distinction to be made between continuations and new applications; professional assessment to be made of quality of existing programs
- Erasmus Mundus Brand Name: for maximum two years: VERY BAD JOKE

The Value

After five years of running an Erasmus Mundus international master programme:

- The alumni are doing extremely well
- The value for the students is "life-changing"
- The value for the institutions is immeasurable
- The value for the global society even more so
