





- Sequential structure







- Challenges specific for the GEM-MSc Course Phase I
 - Travel and expenses related to travel
 i.e. Home Country → SIN Southampton → Lund → Warsaw →
 Enschede → Home Country

 - Time pressure for the students
 - Administrative issues (bank, visa)

GEM - PHASE I: ALUMNI SURVEY

Statistics of an alumni survey (all students) carried out in 2009:

38% continued with doctoral studies

38% employed in a geo-information and/or environmental field

■ 18% other professional employment (journalism, local government, etc.)

• 6% seeking funds for doctoral studies




- Duration: 22 Months / 4 semesters / 120 ECTS
- New structure



















- Year 1 = Foundation / Coursework
 - 60 ECTS
 - 12 modules in UT/ITC or
 - 5 modules in Lund
 - at defined moments: joint lectures, seminars and discussions including all partners (also Southampton, Warsaw, Reykjavik, Sydney)
- Year 2 = Specialization / Thesis
 - 60 ECTS
 - Students move to Southampton, Reykjavik or Warsaw (or Enschede/Lund) – depending on research interest and on interest/demand of the market → SAB



GEM - PHASE II: ROLE OF THE SAB

The SAB provides advice and contributes to the decision making process of the Joint Programme Board (JPB), particularly concerning adjustments required to tune the course to meet European and global needs.

In other words:

The SAB critically reviews the course with the aim to further raise its level of excellence and add value by making the course even more applicable to European and global employers.

 - Programme Coordinator
 - Course Coordinator
 - Financial Coordinator
 - Programme Secretary
- Cooperative Higher Management that sees the added value of coordinating these type of courses
- Reliable, active and flexible partners
- Clear Programme Guidelines
- Transparent selection by EU
